The annual Kla Ha Ya Days Festival will kick off with the carnival at Harvey Field on July 17th followed by a full schedule of events throughout the weekend. Don't forget to buy a discounted ticket for unlimited carnival ride armbands; you'll save \$5.00. They can be purchased through July 16th at McDaniel's Do-It Center, Columbia Bank, and Peoples Bank.

The Frogstastic Kids Fair takes place on Friday, July 19th at Snohomish Station with lots of fun activities for the kids including a bike rodeo.

On Friday evening from 6-10 p.m. there will be a Snohomish High Alumni Party at the Feather Ballroom (the former Eagles Building). Entrance is just \$5/person.

The kid's parade starts at 10:15 a.m. followed by the grand parade at 10:30 a.m. on First Street from Avenue D to Willow Avenue. Bill Fulton is this year's grand marshal.

Following the parade, be sure to stay downtown and check out all the silly games including the famous frog jumping contest, baby crawl, pie and ice cream eating contests, cherry pit spitting, bed races, and more. On both Saturday and Sunday, there will be live music on the Avenue A stage and enjoy the good eats and drinks in the nearby food court and beer garden. The street fair will feature nearly 100 vendors this year.
