Snohomish Police Department Deputy Emmons



Deputy Emmons began his law enforcement career as a Pullman Police Reserve while attending WSU. He graduated Cum Laude from WSU and has 2 years of graduate school. While serving in the Navy he obtained the rank of E-5.

Hired as a Deputy with Whatcom County in 2000, he was the lead Crime Scene Investigator with five Crime Scene Investigators. Additionally, Deputy Emmons was a member of the LEMART team (Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Response Team). He was also a resident Deputy in Point Roberts WA from 2002-2006.

Deputy Emmons was a Field Training Officer and Tactical First Aid instructor. He worked in the Office of Professional Standards and wrote grants for the department.

Deputy Emmons has over 12 years of law enforcement experience and enjoys interacting with the public. He is 42 years old, and married with three children. Deputy Emmons is replacing Deputy Kunard who transferred to East County in February.
