MAPLE AVE SEWER REPLACEMENT PROJECT

UPCOMING CONSTRUCTION

The City is pleased to notify you that the Maple Avenue Sewer Replacement project will begin construction the week of July 4, 2016.

This project consists of installing about 500 linear feet of Sewer Main along Maple Avenue from mid-block between Fourth & Fifth Street to near the entrance to the Aquatic Center. It also includes installing several manhole structures and 13 side sewers all associated with the sewer main installation.

Expect temporary lane closures during construction. Sections of the sidewalk will be temporarily closed during the construction of the side sewer improvements. One lane of traffic will remain open during construction but expect traffic delays. A good north/south alternative for traveling alternative would be to utilize Pine Avenue.

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CITY OF SNOHOMISH BLACKMANS LAKE OUTLET IMPROVEMENT PROJECT SUMMER 2016

UPCOMING CONSTRUCTION

Construction of the Blackmans Lake Outlet Improvement Project is expected to begin this summer.

Blackmans Lake outlet consists of four 24-inch culverts beneath Ferguson Park Road that discharge to Swifty Creek. Over the years debris and sediment has accumulated in Swifty Creek which has decreased its flow capacity. This has caused the lake level to rise during heavy rain storm events causing flooding problems.

This project includes the replacement of the four culverts, construction of an overflow channel along Avenue A, an earth berm, sediment and debris removal, paving Ferguson Park Road and Avenue A north of 13th Street, sidewalk improvements, plantings, clearing, grading, surface restoration, erosion control, traffic control, and other related items.

Expect traffic delays, temporary lane/road closures and limited access to Ferguson Park during construction. Lower area of Ferguson Park will be closed during paving.

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2016 UTILITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

INTRODUCTION

The utilities and roadway will be improved on Seventh Street between Pine and Mill Avenues, and at the intersection of Tenth Street and Mill Avenue. Sewer and water pipes will be replaced and storm drainage pipes will be installed. The roadway will then be paved after the utility work is completed. This project is funded by the City Utility Budget and Transportation Benefit District.

Bids for these neighborhood projects will be opened on Friday, July 8, 2016, and awarded at the July 19, 2016, council meeting. Construction is anticipated to occur during August and September 2016.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Seventh Street Neighborhood

The work to be completed will take place in Seventh Street between Pine Avenue and Mill Avenue. The work consists of road reconstruction, asphalt surfacing, and installation of new sewer, storm drainage and water utility infrastructure including new water and sewer services to each customer's property line. Please see the reverse side of this flyer for an overview of the construction area and project limits.

Tenth Street Neighborhood

The work to be completed will take place in the intersection of Tenth Street and Mill Avenue. The work consists of installation of a new sewer main, asphalt overlay and associated curb/gutter and sidewalk replacement. Please see the reverse side of this flyer for an overview of the construction area and project limits.

Construction Noise and Utility Service Interruption

We are notifying you in advance that this project will generate construction noise within surrounding neighborhoods Monday through Friday during the contractor's working hours of 7AM - 7PM. Additionally, residents will experience planned interruptions in water and sewer service when the new pipes and individual services are activated. You will be notified a minimum of 24 hours in advance of all planned utility service interruptions.

Temporary Access Delays

Seventh Street between Pine Avenue and Mill Avenue and the intersection of Tenth Street and Mill Avenue will be closed at separate times during project construction. For the Seventh Street closure, there will be local access only for those residents residing on Seventh Street. However, due to the nature of the project, from time to time access to Seventh Street properties and ingress and egress on Seventh Street will be interrupted and delayed.


We will make every effort to minimize these disturbances however, we ask that residents anticipate these traffic delays during construction and plan accordingly. We apologize in advance for any inconvenience.

2016 Utility Improvement Project


7th Street between Pine Avenue and Mill Avenue Project Area
