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Maple Avenue Overlay Delayed (Second Street to Pine Avenue)

Paving of Maple Avenue from Second Street to Pine Avenue has been delayed due to weather. The tentative schedule to pave is on September 7 and 8. This schedule is dependent on weather and any delays during construction. Expect traffic delays and temporary road/lane closures. Parking will not be allowed along this segment of Maple Avenue during this time. Asphalt grinding has been completed.



Pilchuck Park Sprinkler System and Field 1 Maintenance



This summer, City staff has been working feverishly to make repairs to the Pilchuck Park sprinkler system and baseball field # 1 in preparation for the upcoming fall baseball and flag football season.

The sprinkler system was originally installed in 1976 when the park was built. Its effective use had diminished over the years, and approximately eight years ago, the Parks Department quit using the sprinkler system entirely due to the recession, and the antiquated system being very labor intensive to operate.

The sprinkler system maintenance is now complete, which included electrical system repairs, twelve separate sprinkler main line breaks, and the pump and control wiring. The system is now functioning well and the pump pressure is holding at a consistent pressure.

Field 1 maintenance is also underway. Staff spread topsoil over the outfield to smooth out the uneven ground, and then placed grass seed over the new topsoil. Staff removed the grass infield, installed seventy tons of infield mix, and cut all grass edges so everything looks straight and true. The newly repaired sprinkler system is watering the grass and the new grass is starting to grow. Just a few more weeks and the park will be ready for use!
